Pastoral Musing June 23, 2020 (Eve of the Nativity of St. John Baptist)

It's not ANTIFA or Black Lives Matter. It's not Planned Parenthood or the Human Rights Campaign (LGBTQ organization). It's not Big Tech or Corporate America. It's not the Democrats or the Republicans.

The current condition of the United States of America is not the blame of any of the aforementioned. It's not! Oh, each has a role for sure. Each is a pawn in the hands of the evil one. But they are not to blame.

Who is to blame? The Church! Christians, you and I are to blame.

For my entire lifetime at least, Christians; men and women who have been baptized and confirmed or made a profession for Christ, have wanted to adulterate, fornicate and contracept. We've (a good number) wanted unrestrained materialism. "Rugged individualism" has evolved into egotism and self-righteousness. In summary, we've wanted as much of the world as we can have while still feeling like Christians.
